Consumption is, of course, also situated in space and time and thus contextual and constructed in different places and at different moments in history. This course investigates in detail a classic of colonial literature, William Shakespeare's tragedy *Othello*, before turning to a range of postcolonial literary (re)visions of Shakespeare's play.

Please also note that this course deals with literature which contains drastic and emotionally challenging depictions of violence and suffering, including racialised violence, sexualised violence, and representations of the Jewish holocaust.

The modern international literary system is clearly marked, and to some extent impoverished, by the unquestioned hegemony of the prose novel, which not only overshadows all other textual forms in the (world-)literary market but also consistently enjoys pride of place in literary criticism with its long tradition of foregrounding the novel at the expense of alternative modes and forms. As a result the space of world literature appears as a generic monoculture. Yet regardless of the critical overemphasis on the novel, a multitude of alternate forms proliferate, engendering an unacknowledged yet vital biodiversity. One of these alternate forms is the verse novel that has gained increasing popularity over the past two or three decades. As a 'literary misfit' it deviates from and to some extent unsettles the novel-centrist norm but it all the same has to operate within the literary field as it is: novel-centered. Verse novels therefore are not anti-novels but novels with a difference -- and that difference makes all the difference.

In our seminar we will read and discuss three of the most influential examples – Derek Walcott's *Omeros* (1990), Bernardine Evaristo's *The Emperor's Babe* (2001), and Anne Carson's *Autobiography of Red* (1998). In concert, these texts will not only take us across a wide range of settings from the postcolonial Caribbean (Walcott) via the Roman colony of Britannia (Evaristo) to Canada and the High Andes (Carson), but also give us a taste of the amazing formal diversity and volatility of the contemporary verse novel.

Moreover, students will in small groups prepare a poster presentation on one additional verse novel that they may choose freely or from a list of suggested texts. The last two meetings of the semester will be reserved for poster presentations.

Kommentar

In part one of this block seminar covering two intensive weekends, we will view and discuss selected films and film extracts that illuminate the critical discourse of whiteness including works such as *White Zombie*, *The Exorcist*, *Whity* and *Get Out*. We will engage with theoretical and life writing on whiteness, including the work of thinkers such as Richard Dyer, George Yancy, Robin D'Angelo, Claudia Rankine, Langston Hughes, Noel Ignatiev, Layla Saad and Kehinde Andrews. Students will be given creative and life-writing tasks to undertake in response to the films and theoretical writing. Students will develop a script for stage or screen, between the first weekend workshop and the second weekend workshop, four weeks later. Part two will then provide an opportunity for students to read their work and receive supportive critical feedback before submission. Participation in both weekends is essential.

One of these alternate forms is the verse novel that has gained increasing popularity over the past two or three decades. As a 'literary misfit' it deviates from and to some extent unsettles the novel-centrist norm but it all the same has to operate within the literary field as it is: novel-centered. Verse novels therefore are not anti-novels but novels with a difference -- and that difference makes all the difference.

In our seminar we will read and discuss three of the most influential examples – Derek Walcott's *Omeros* (1990), Bernardine Evaristo's *The Emperor's Babe* (2001), and Anne Carson's *Autobiography of Red* (1998). In concert, these texts will not only take us across a wide range of settings from the postcolonial Caribbean (Walcott) via the Roman colony of Britannia (Evaristo) to Canada and the High Andes (Carson), but also give us a taste of the amazing formal diversity and volatility of the contemporary verse novel.

Moreover, students will in small groups prepare a poster presentation on one additional verse novel that they may choose freely or from a list of suggested texts. The last two meetings of the semester will be reserved for poster presentations.

Prüfungsleistung

Handelt es sich um eine unbenotete Prüfungsleistung, so muss dieses ausdrücklich („unbenotet“) in der Modulbeschreibung der fachspezifischen Ordnung geregelt sein. 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
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
