Improving your expression in and knowledge of English through intensive comparison and contrast with German: that is the main purpose of this course. Translation is a powerful tool for improving your proficiency because it uses your native language - your semantic bedrock that all your explorations in the second language build up from. Alan Duff: 'Translation develops three qualities essential to all language learning: flexibility, accuracy, and clarity. It trains the learner to search (flexibility) for the most appropriate words (accuracy) to convey what is meant (clarity).' You learn to think from words and structures to meanings - translation sensitizes you to the nuances of style and meaning better than anything other language learning activity. By contrasting the meanings of words and syntax, you can move away from literal (whatever that means!) translations to meaning (whatever that is!). When you think about it, any real interaction with an author or a person speaking involves acts of translation - the deeper the engagement, the more challenging and fruitful the translation.

Social interaction is forms the foundation through which we organize our lives and accomplish action(s) together, whether in mundane, everyday interaction or more formal, institutional encounters. Social interaction is also the most fundamental arena of language use, language learning and language change. But how does social interaction work? How is it organized? And how can we describe its workings scientifically? As the first course in the module on spoken and written communication, this course is designed to introduce students to basic concepts and methods in Conversation Analysis (CA) and Interactional Linguistics (IL). Together with M(S)K2, this course will enable students to study human social interaction, describe recurrent interactional patterns (existing and new), and eventually work in areas which require expertise in spoken communication. We will explore relevant concepts and methods together and thereby develop a better idea of what distinguishes CA and IL from other approaches to spoken language. Through this exploration, students will develop insight into how human interaction works.

In capitalism, production and consumption are engaged in a process of constant negotiation but while Marx still emphasised the notion of production, it is to state the obvious that from the rise of mass culture, the focus has shifted to an increased interest in consumption which is not only an economic factor but also a culturally significant practice and as such not only affects the forces of globalisation but also to a large extent our everyday lives. Consumption is, of course, also situated in space and time and thus contextual and constructed in different places and at different moments in history. This course is designed to look at the history of consumption as well as some of the theoretical debates surrounding it to explore questions of agency, resistance, identity construction, consumption spaces and commercial cultures.

Kommentar

The modern international literary system is clearly marked, and to some extent impoverished, by the unquestioned hegemony of the prose novel, which not only overshadows all other textual forms in the (world-)literary market but also consistently enjoys pride of place in literary criticism with its long tradition of foregrounding the novel at the expense of alternative modes and forms. As a result the space of world literature appears as a generic monoculture. Yet regardless of the critical overemphasis on the novel, a multitude of alternate forms proliferate, engendering an unacknowledged yet vital biodiversity. One of these alternate forms is the verse novel that has gained increasing popularity over the past two or three decades. As a 'literary misfit' it deviates from and to some extent unsettles the novel-centrist norm but it all the same has to operate within the literary field as it is: novel-centered. Verse novels therefore are not anti-novels but novels with a difference -- and that difference makes all the difference.

In our seminar we will read and discuss three of the most influential examples – Derek Walcott's *Omeros* (1990), Bernardine Evaristo's *The Emperor's Babe* (2001), and Anne Carson's *Autobiography of Red* (1998). In concert, these texts will not only take us across a wide range of settings from the postcolonial Caribbean (Walcott) via the Roman colony of Britannia (Evaristo) to Canada and the High Andes (Carson), but also give us a taste of the amazing formal diversity and volatility of the contemporary verse novel.

Moreover, students will in small groups prepare a poster presentation on one additional verse novel that they may choose freely or from a list of suggested texts. The last two meetings of the semester will be reserved for poster presentations.

Kommentar

This course introduces participants to issues related to identity in the context of English language learning and teaching. It adopts a two-pronged approach to identity. First, it establishes the relevance of identity in language learning (student identity) and second, it helps participants explore their own teacher identity.

Throughout this seminar, participants will gain a critical perspective in language ideologies, language learning theories, culture, as well as various identity categories such as gender, sexuality, class, race and ethnicity. On this basis, they will relate these issues to the English language classroom (e.g., learning materials and classroom practices). This seminar explores how AI is transforming English Language Education. We will critically discuss and explore how AI-based technology can effectively enhance L2 learning and teaching. The focus will not only be on (1) how AI can assist L2 teachers with, e.g. lesson planning, material development, diagnostics and assessment, but mainly on (2) how L2 learners can benefit from AI-based activities and how AI-based tools and methods can be applied in the English language classroom. The goal is to enable students to critically analyse the quality of AI-based tools for L2 learning and teaching as well as the value of human interaction in the L2 classroom. This course introduces participants to issues related to identity in the context of English language learning and teaching. It adopts a two-pronged approach to identity. First, it establishes the relevance of identity in language learning (student identity) and second, it helps participants explore their own teacher identity.

Throughout this seminar, participants will gain a critical perspective in language ideologies, language learning theories, culture, as well as various identity categories such as gender, sexuality, class, race and ethnicity. This seminar explores how AI is transforming English Language Education. We will critically discuss and explore how AI-based technology can effectively enhance L2 learning and teaching. <p>The modern international literary system is clearly marked, and to some extent impoversihed, by the unquestioned hegemony of the prose novel, which not only overshadows all other textual forms in the (world-)literary market but also consistently enjoys pride of place in literary criticism with its long tradition of foregrounding the novel at the expense of alternative modes and forms. As a result the space of world literature appears as a generic monoculture. Yet regardless of the critical overemphasis on the novel, a multitude of alternate forms proliferate, engendering an unacknowledged yet vital biodiversity. One of these alternate forms is the verse novel that has gained increasing popularity over the past two or three decades. As a 'literary misfit' it deviates from and to some extent unsettles the novel-centrist norm but it all the same has to operate within the literary field as it is: novel-centered. Verse novels therefore are not anti-novels but novels with a difference -- and that difference makes all the difference.</p> <p>In our seminar we will read and discuss three of the most influential examples – Derek Walcott's <i>Omeros</i> (1990), Bernardine Evaristo's <i>The Emperor's Babe</i> (2001), and Anne Carson's <i>Autobiography of Red</i> (1998). In concert, these texts will not only take us across a wide range of settings from the postcolonial Caribbean (Walcott) via the Roman colony of Britannia (Evaristo) to Canada and the High Andes (Carson), but also give us a taste of the amazing formal diversity and volatility of the contemporary verse novel.</p> <p>Moreover, students will in small groups prepare a poster presentation on one additional verse novel that they may choose freely or from a list of suggested texts. The last two meetings of the semester will be reserved for poster presentations.</p>
